

Notes to Occupational Therapy Transfer Candidates:

This form must be received before your application is considered complete.

Enter "IP" if course is currently in progress or will be completed prior to USP enrollment. When available, updated transcripts must be forwarded to the USP Admission Office documenting the completion of all coursework listed "in progress."

Appropriate substitute courses are listed in parentheses ().

Intellectual Heritage I & II are unique interdisciplinary courses that are part of the USP Curriculum. A sequence of courses designed to achieve a balance between specialized study and exposure to a diversity of ideas, perspectives and modes of thinking. Year three transfer students most often satisfy this requirement through courses in the humanities, social sciences, fine arts, moral reasoning/philosophy or historical studies.

Since USP's third year begins during the summer between second and third year with Neuroanatomy (Lab), prerequisite coursework must be completed by the end of the preceeding Spring semester. **The Neuroanatomy (Lab) course must be completed at USP.**

• General Education requirements can be fulfilled through the following Social Sciences: Anthropology, Communication, Economics, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, Social Science or Humanities: Arabic, Art, Chinese, Classics, English, French, German, History, Humanities, Latin, Music, Philosophy, Spanish, World Cultures.

* For Fall 2009, candidates admitted for transfer to the 1st year are subject to the Writing and Rhetoric I and II requirement. Candidates admitted for transfer to the 2nd or 3rd year are subject to the College Composition and Intro to Literature requirement. Credits accepted for transfer for Writing and Rhetoric I and II, College Composition and Intro to Literature are subject to confirmation by the USP Humanities Department.
