Year three transfer students most often satisfy this requirement through courses in the humanities, social sciences, fine arts, moral reasoning/philosophy or historical studies.

\* For Fall 2009, candidates admitted for transfer to the 1st year are subject to the Writing and Rhetoric I and II requirement. Candidates admitted for transfer to the 2nd or 3rd year are subject to the College Composition and Intro to Literature requirement. Credits accepted for transfer for Writing and Rhetoric I and II, College Composition and Intro to Literature are subject to confirmation by the USP Humanities Department.

Note: USP will only admit transfer candidates to the 1st or 2nd year of the Physician Assistant Studies Program Pre-professional phase. If you have earned or will earn a Bachelor's Degree by the end of Spring 2009 semester, you may be eligible for entrance to the Physician Assistant Studies program professional phase at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine.
